

Introduction to the Passive Voice

What is the passive and why do we use it?

To switch focus away from the subject to the object:

1. we don't know the subject	My bike <i>has been stolen</i> .			
2. when the authority is obvious -	<mark>Smoking</mark> <u>is not allowed</u> .			
usually the law but it could be	Ball games are prohibited.			
any authority

Rules

- 1. always use be + past participle
- 2. you can use the passive in different tenses
- 3. the passive changes form in different tenses
- 4. **be** changes in different tenses
- 5. the *past participle* NEVER changes
- 6. you can introduce the subject/agent after 'by'
- 7. the verb is important in terms of direct/indirect objects:

- Mr Smith was given instructions regarding his operation.
- Instructions were given to Mr Smith regarding his operation.
- A nurse gave Mr Smith instructions regarding his operation.
- A nurse **gave** instructions to Smith regarding his operation.

explain

- The instructions regarding his operation were explained to Mr Smith.
- The nurse **explained** the instructions regarding his operation to Mr Smith.
- Mr Smith was explained
- The nurse explained Mr Smith

- The windows *cannot be fixed* right now because they *are being cleaned*.


