Medical research is the most usual primary purpose for images.

Patients are consulted in relation to the primary purpose of images.

Images intended for training purposes don't require patient consent.

There are 4 ways that we usually eliminate:

- 1. Not given: not in the text
- 2. Partially true: not 100% true
- 3. Doesn't answer the question
- 4. Opposite idea is in the text

The text highlights...

The text emphasises...

The text outlines...

The main point of the text is...

The purpose of the conferences ...

The primary use of the equipment is...
