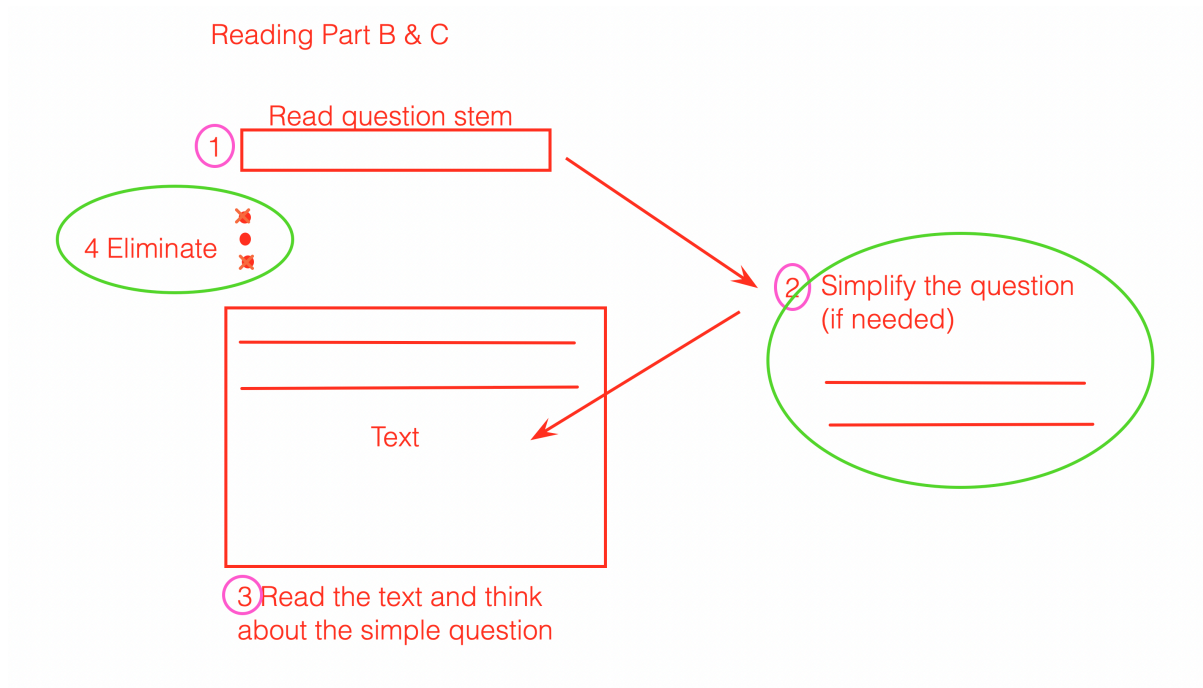

What is elimination?

This usually a Reading Part B & C technique

- ~~A~~ this should be reported.
- B staff should dispose of them securely.
- ~~C~~ they should be sent back to the supplier.

This means to exclude / rule out / remove the options which are not the answer.

Note: 50 / 50

usually get more or less easy one

- The two reports mentioned in the first paragraph both concluded that homeopathy
- could be harmful if not used appropriately.
 - merely works on the same basis as the placebo effect.
 - lacks any form of convincing proof of its value as a treatment.
 - would require further investigation before it was fully understood.

usually find another one

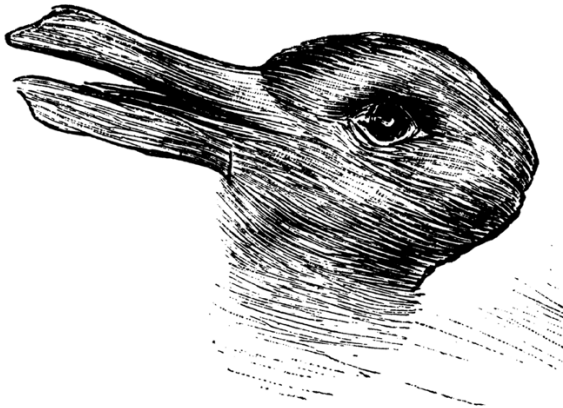
