## What is summarising?

Definition: Give a brief statement / make it smaller / make it concise

I need to do this in OET because they very often give you LOTS of <u>information</u> in thew caes notes.

Sometimes we have:

- Relevant case notes where detail is needed
- Relevant case notes where you must summarise
- Irrelevant case notes

#### How do we summarise?

Reduce a large amount of information down by...

- Avoid repeating: 'aforementioned
- Use words that refer to something the reader already knows: 'accordingly'

'He had a headache and was treated accordingly,'

The reader will know

- Listing
- Main ideas

### **Symptoms:**

CASE NOTES: Sore throat, cough, headache, runny nose

Mr Green had flu-like symptoms – if the reader needs detail then this is very bad.

Mr Green had upper respiratory symptoms



#### Medicine:

Augmentin: 875/125mg orally twice a day

Panadeine Forte: 30/500mg twice a day or every six hours

Verapamil: 80mg / three times a day

Imagine the reader doesn't need the detail. How would you summarise this?

#### What is a list?

Example:

He is taking Augmentin, Panadeine Forte, paracetamol, apples, and verapamil as well as coffee

Oxford comma

#### RULE:

- A list must have 3 or more items.
- Each item must have a comma except for the last one which optional
- You must list according verbs, nouns, etc,

We only use capitals for brand names: Nike, Tylenol

• Wt: 80kg, Ht: 190cm

### **MAIN IDEA:**

All vital signs are normal except...

**Be careful:** only summarise when the reader does not need DETAILS.



# What is listing?

## DIAGRAM ABOUT DIFFERENT TYPES OF LISTING

Туре	Example	Examples
Noun listing	She experienced dizziness, tired, nausea, and anxiety She experienced dizziness, tiredness, nausea, and vomiting  Rule: All items in the list must be nouns  Rule: All nouns must match with the one verb	Mr Green <u>had</u> a rash, backache, anxiety, palpitations, <u>and</u> he was light-headed  Trick:  After 'and' you are allowed to put Subject and a verb.
Verb listing	She experienced dizziness, vomited, visited the doctor, and medication has been prescribed  Rule: Each item must have a verb. 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Case notes: List these Items

14 Oct: Pt attended: dizziness & chest pains; his mother = anxiety

On 14<sup>th</sup> October, Mr Green experienced dizziness, chest pains, and <u>his mother had anxiety</u>

15 Sept: stops antidepressants

22 Sept: mood swings reported

10 Oct: restarted: Fluoxetine

Mr Green stopped antidepressants on  $15^{th}$  September, mood swings were reported on  $22^{nd}$  September, and was restarted on Fluoxetine on  $10^{th}$  October
