What is summarising and why is it useful?

To make it shorter / extract the gist / to make concise / to be brief

It is useful because <u>OET ask you to do it</u> and it <u>saves time</u>.

Conciseness & Clarity = 0 to 7

Sometimes you lots of RELEVANT details

What techniques can we use to summarise?

- Listing: Mr Green presented with a headache, shortness of breath, as well as nausea.
- Main idea: just giving the gist / one words that applies to all
- **Avoid repetition:** if you said it already you can use 'aforementioned symptoms' / 'his symptoms improved'



MAIN IDEA

Case notes:

19th May: blurred vision, watery eyes, itchy eyeballs, and blood shot eyes

In May, Mrs Green had eye issues.

Be careful with main idea summary.

RULE: Only summarise with main idea when the reader doesn't need the full details



LISTING: difficult because you need to think about grammar / word type / rules

Resistive behaviour (argues, yells/shouts, pulls away from staff when attempts to guide)

Resistant to care from female nurses Refuses to walk/take meals dining room

Insists bath weekly only

Mr Green was admitted to our facility from acute care. He was forgetful of recent events, showed resistive behaviour especially from female nurses, refused to walk to the dining room, and insisted on having a bath once a week.

AVOID REPETITION

I am writing to refer Ms Thompson, who was admitted to our facility for right total shoulder replacement surgery due to osteoarthritis. She is being discharged today and now requires ongoing care and support.

On 11th July, MS Thompson underwent right total shoulder replacement surgery due to osteoarthritis. During hospitalization, ...

On 11th July, MS Thompson underwent the aforementioned surgery... above mentioned...

You need the vocabulary



Vocabulary for Summarising
