USED TO = Verb

USED TO

<p>Used + infinitive</p>	<p>Past habit <i>FINISHED</i></p> <p>Past simple is best</p>	<p>I used to play harmonia</p> <p>“Did you use to take your medicine on time?” Aux. S. used to + inf.</p> <p>He is not compliant NOW and you want check about the past.</p>
<p>Be + used to + noun</p>	<p>Already familiar (well known)</p> <p>FINISHED</p>	<p>I am used to Zoom now</p> <p>Mr Green is used to taking his medication regularly</p> <p>“Are you used to your new treatment?” Be. S. used to + noun.</p>
<p>Get + used to + noun</p>	<p>Process of becoming familiar (well known)</p> <p>UNFINISHED</p>	<p>I am getting to Zoom</p> <p>Mr Green is still getting used to walking, so please encourage more independence</p> <p>“Are you still getting used to your new hearing aid?” Aux. S. ING used to</p> <p>(“How are you getting on with your...?”)</p>

Negatives and Questions: Used To
