Find me the Participle Clause? Find me the Relative Clause?

PARTICIPLE CLAUSE: it connects 2 events

On 5th March, Mr Taylor presented with respiratory infection along with rust coloured sputum and a temperature of 38°C, for which he was prescribed with amoxicillin. Having experienced persistent symptoms, investigations were performed, which revealed Stage IIA non-small cell lung cancer and tumour of 2.5 cm in his left lung, however, his bronchial branches are not affected. After that, ...

RELATIVE CLAUSE:
Gives extra information
about the clause before



Participle clauses deal with the connection between events:

Watching TV, I called my mother – SAME TIME

The bomb exploded, injuring seven people – RESULT

Etc.

There are 5 connections we should learn

Diagram:

Example	Meaning: connection?
1. Watching TV on Monday, Mr. Green also called his mother. ING + noun phrase [nouns, prepositions, articles] , S v	Same time
	1. Cook /dinner / kitchen / Mr Green / listening /radio
2. Opening the envelope, he read the referral letter ING + noun phrase [nouns, etc.]. , S. v	One immediately after the other
	2. door / night / she / see / scary man Opening the door at night-time, she saw the scary man
3. Having opened the envelope, he read the referral letter	One after the other
	3. finish / essay / OET exam / sleep / hours Having finished the essay in the OET exam on Saturday, he slept for hours
4. A car crashed, injuring Mrs. Green's left shoulder S V ING clause is RESULT	Result (comes second)
	4. tree / fell / evening/ break / left / leg A tree fell in the evening, breaking Mr Green's left leg
5. Being a doctor, he works a lot Being +noun , S+verb	Reason why (come first)
Having [possession] + noun, S + verb This is state / condition	5. nurse / tertiary hospital / June / care and support Being a nurse in a tertiary hospital, she provides care and support in June
