- Check advice that I already

Have you been doing your exercise? – Present Perfect

Have you quit smoking? – Present Perfect

1. Start from past and continues to now
2. Relevant

BE question

Aux.	Subject	ING / adj. / noun	
Are	you	A doctor?	

Pain: always use continuous to talk about pain

Are you experiencing any pain?

What is a closed question?

Yes / No question

What is an open question?

Cannot answer yes / no

Normal

Extra: food, cars, coffee, medication

Note: a closed question can have an open meaning

Can you tell me about your medication? – OPEN

Aux S verb

Could you tell me more about...?

Would you mind if I asked you about your haircut? - permission

Would you mind telling me about...? – permission

Is it okay if I ask you about you diet? – permission

1 What is causing your issue?*

The heading is causing my issue.

2 Why are you not taking your medication?

3 When did the pain start?

4 Why have you visited today?

5 What things have you done to alleviate the pain?

6 What medication have you stopped taking recently?

7 Who told you the exercise is safe?*

The doctor told you the exercise is safe.

8 How long did the pain last?

9 How many times have you been experiencing the problem?

Wh - + AUX. + Subject + verb / noun / adj. ING

1 I usually get up early and go for a run

2 I just done trust doctors and the medication they give me
