

Present Perfect

There is always some kind of connection between the past and the present. It's not always obvious but it is always there.

Remember: Perfect = before in grammatical terms.

Past simple: I did a complicated operation yesterday.

Present simple: I often do complicated operations.

Present Perfect simple: I have done three complicated operations in the past 4 days.

I have worked hard today.

Present Perfect: subject + has/have + past participle = I have done / She has visited

for and since

for	I lived in France for 10 years. I have been feeling sick for 48 hours. My party will last for six hours. I usually work out for 30 minutes a day.
since	I <u>have been feeling</u> sick since we spoke on the phone. I <u>have lived</u> in France since 2012.
the last year / month / five days	Past simple: Last year I <u>visited</u> Canada. Present Perfect: In the last year I <u>have done</u> 16 job interviews!
	Present Perfect: In the past five days I have eaten Italian food twice.
