

# **Sentence Structure**

We're going to start reviewing sentence structure!

To do this we have to understand 4 important things:

The relationship between ideas	John had an operation although his mobility had improved.		
What a clause is	A clause is a section of a sentence which contains a complete idea		
The difference between a verb clause and a noun clause	verb clause: a section of a sentence that contains either subject + verb or object + verb		
	Two verb clauses: <u>John had an operation</u> although <u>his mobility had improved</u> .		
	noun clause: a section of a sentence that contains either noun or noun phrase		
	Nurses take the OET exam due to the NMC's requirements.		
The way the verb 'be' is used in various sentences / forms	<ul> <li>passive: be + past participle</li> <li>adjectives: is happy / was sad</li> <li>there is / there are: There is a big cat in my garden.</li> <li>noun form: being</li> </ul>

3.	The ECG produced inconsistent results. It was repaired.	The ECG was repaired <b>because</b> it produced inconsistent results.	The ECG was repaired <b>due to</b> producing inconsistent results.
4.	He had an inoperable tumour. Bert underwent chemotherapy.	Bert underwent chemotherapy because he had an inoperable tumor.	Bert underwent chemotherapy as a result of having an inoperable tumor.

#### **Exercise 2**

- 1) John Edwards/chemotherapy/start/5 days ago/nausea
- John Edwards commenced chemotherapy 5 days ago, resulting in nausea.
- John was feeling nausea **due to** <u>chemotherapy</u>, **which** was started 5 days ago.
- John Edwards stopped chemo 5 days ago due to nausea
- **Due to the fact that** John Edwards started chemotherapy 5 days ago, he has nausea.
- 2) experience/acute pain/stomach ulcer/meal times/Sarah Johnson
- Sarah Johnson has been experiencing acute pain at meal times **due to** having a stomach ulcer.
- As a result of having a stomach ulcer, Sarah Johnson has been experiencing acute pain at meal times.
- Sarah Johnson has a stomach ulcer, and as a result, she has been experiencing acute pain at meal times.
- Sarah Johnson has a stomach ulcer, resulting in (her experiencing) acute pain at meal times.
- 3) blurred vision/work accident/Bruce Roberts /signed off/ 4 weeks
- Bruce Roberts has developed blurred vision **due to** a work accident, **and as a result,** he has been signed off for 4 weeks.



Bruce Roberts has been signed off for 4 weeks due to having blurred eyes, as a result of a work
