

What is Past Perfect?

Meaning: 'past of past'



Example:

+ Mrs Green had finished her medication

- Mrs Green had not finished her medication

? Had Mrs Green (not) finished her medication?







On 5th May, Mrs Green reported that she had experienced ear ache for 5 days since 1st May.

5 days ago

When do we use it?







2 TYPES PAST PERFECT:



not stopping

TYPE 1: continuous action between 2 points

1 inform / neck pain / 3 days

Mrs Green informed me that she <u>had experienced</u> neck pain for 3 days

Mrs Green informed me that she had been experiencing neck pain for 3 days

Past Perfect Continuous

2 report / depression / 2 weeks

Mrs Green reported that she had depression for 2 weeks.

3 state / pain: rash / 48 hours

4 inform / dizzy / 2 days



TYPE 2: happens only once



- reported / car crash / last week
 Mrs Green reported that she had had a car accident at 9:am on Wednesday
 S had PP
- 2. stated / panic attack / yesterday
- 3. inform / sprained ankle / work
- 4. report / head injury / rugby / 48 hours
- 5. state / refer / new psychologist
