






Re: Mr Peter Smith DOB 18.03.1932	
I am writing regarding Mr Smith, who has visited clinic recently due to issues with diabetes compliance. He is due to be discharged and he now requires further care and support.	
On September 2017, Mr Smith was diagnosed with type 2 diabetes, and it was controlled with metformin and through his diet. On October 2018, Mr Smith has shown signs diabetic neuropathy and restricted mobility, as a result of being providing him with walking with a stick. Additionally, he has consistently shown resistance to his medication regimen and dietary restriction. Mr. Smith has continued to consume excessive amounts of alcohol and fatty foods, salt, sugar since death of his wife last year, but now his daughter will cook for him. On June 2018, Mr Smith was admitted City Hospital in Newtown with myocardial infarction. He was diagnosed with atrial fibrillation and the doctors have treated him. He has recovered well.	
In terms of his background, he is a smoker and the medication currently prescribed for him include Metformin 500 mg, Ramipril 5 mg daily for hypertension, Warfarin variable 53-5 mg, Sotalol 40 mg daily.	
In view of the above, it would be greatly appreciated if you could provide further care and assistance to Mr Smith. Do not hesitate to get in touch with me for any question.
