



Thank you for urgently seeing admitting Joshua Vance, who has was presented with a three-week history of constipation and dehydration. Your further assessment and rehydration would be appreciated.		
On 31/12/2013, Joshua's mother referred presented and said that Joshua was only having one bowel action with hard stools every 3 -days. His hydration status was normal, and consequently mild constipation was suspected. She was advised to dilute feeds with water.		
On 13/01/2014, Joshua presented with no improvements of in his constipation and was partially refusing breastfeeding. He was also waking up during the night, crying and pulling his legs up to his chest. He was prescribed Coloxyl drops daily, and

Dear Ms Jane Graham,

I am writing regarding Mr Jones, who has a severe lower back strain due to a back injury. He requires your assessment of his workplace.

Regarding Mr Jones' occupation, he drives a fork<u>lift</u> in a large warehouse, which involves prolonged sitting and occasional heavy lifting. He is currently on naproxen and carisoprodol.

Initially, Mr Jones reported that 'he had hurt his back while lifting a heavy box off the floor at work' and as a result of him not resting, his pain had become worse. His X-ay showed no disc problems. He was advised **to walk** daily with a gradual increase in time and distance. Additionally, **he was recommended to take** thirty days off work. **He** was encouraged to consider changing his career given his ongoing issues. On 18th April 2015, Mr Jones's condition has had not improved. He walks could only walk ten minutes per day due to stiffness. Although and the exercises with the physiotherapist were very painful, but Mr Jones was compliant.

On 19th May 2015, Mr Jones has had been recovering well but he was still in pain. On 20th June 2015, Mr Jones reported that his's pain would increase after 20-30 minutes of sitting or lying down. During our discussion, Mr Jones said that he was bored and, restless at home and that he wants to work. Additionally, returning work was suggested if there was no lifting and his wife also recommended him to return if there are regular breaks. Please note that playing sport was not permited and taking publicx transport was not allowed.

In view of the above, it would be appreciated if you could provide an assessment of Mr Jones's workplace. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any further questions.

When Mr Jones refused to do his exercises, he may also need to be advised on other small lifestyle issues.


