- <u>Verbs</u>: look for,

Prescribed with antibiotics

- 1 Mrs Green was discharged <u>in</u> the morning with her husband.
- 2 <u>In</u> July 2019, Mrs Smith started her treatment.
- 3 Mr Jones returned **to** the clinic with worsening symptoms.
- 4 The medication should be taken once <u>after/at</u> bedtime.
- 5 The <u>rehabilitation</u> programme is scheduled to run for 6 months. = length

The <u>rehabilitation</u> programme is scheduled to run <u>in</u> 6 months. = 1. Approximate After 6 months it will start / 2. Inside 6 months (usually)

Don't worry, your will have op in six months = usually after 6 months



I am writing to update you on the condition of Mr. Johnson, who was admitted to our hospital last Tuesday <u>after</u> sustain<u>ing</u> a severe leg injury during a workplace accident.

On  $19^{th}$  June, Mr Johnson presented with multiple fractures and extensive soft tissue damage. During his admission, we have been closely monitoring his progress. The initial surgery was performed successfully, and Mr. Johnson has been <u>responding</u> well <u>to</u> post-operative care. He will remain under observation in the orthopaedics ward until the end of the week. I plan <u>to</u> visit him tomorrow morning to assess his mobility and pain levels. We anticipate that physical therapy will commence <u>on</u> Monday <u>at</u> 9:00am to aid in his recovery. Please advise on any further interventions or assessments that you deem necessary. Please also note that he will need to return to out hospital for a check up February 2024.
