

Verb Patterns

Sometimes we follow verbs with other verbs:
Auxiliary:
Do you <u>like</u> sport?
I <i>have</i> <u>eaten</u> today.
I do not <u>like</u> sport.
• Modal:
I <i>can</i> <u>speak</u> 4 languages.
You <i>should</i> <u>visit</u> your parents more often.
We <i>must</i> <u>wear</u> a seatbelt.
• Verb Pattern:
I want <u>to eat</u> .



There are rules when we do this but it's not always easy to spot when we should use them!

Here is some guidance:

- 1) verb pattern: verb + action
- 2) Sometimes the same verb can be followed by different forms: *infinitive/gerund*
- 3) Sometimes this means the same thing: prefer
- 4) Sometimes it means something different:

try	The room was warm. We tried opening the window but it didn't help.
	- We opened the window. The temperature remained the same.
	The room was warm. We <u>tried to open</u> the window but it was locked.
	- We couldn't open the window.
stop	I had a marathon. I stopped smoking.
	- I no longer had the habit of smoking.
	I had a marathon. I stopped to smoke.
	- I stopped running, so I could have a cigarette.



Here are the four basic patterns:

to + infinitive	gerund	object + to + infinitive	Preposition + gerund

Important! When objects are involved, the passive can be used:

advise

active: The doctor advised Mr Smith to do more exercise.

passive: Mr Smith was advised to do more exercise.

need

active: I need to paint my fence.

passive: My fence needs painting/needs to be painted

Possible OET situations, in which we would use the passive:

- The wound <u>needs to be dressed</u> / <u>needs dressing</u>
- The stitches <u>need to be removed / require removing</u>

Things can be a bit different if you include the object + infinitive:

active: I <u>need you</u> to paint my fence.

passive: You are needed to paint my fence. (unnatural)

Report

Reported that: (+verb clause)

How she felt on the 1st June: Mrs Smith presented on the 1st of June. She reported that she felt sick.

How she felt leading up to the 1st **June:** Mrs Smith presented on the 1st of June. She reported that she had been experiencing abdominal pain for three weeks.

Reported: (+ ing)

How she felt on the 1st June: Mrs Smith presented on the 1st of June. She reported feeling sick.

How she felt leading up to the 1st **June:** Mrs Smith presented on the 1st of June. She reported having experienced abdominal pain for 3 weeks.

Multiple verb patterns:

She **reported that** she <u>wanted to change</u> her medication. She reported wanting to change her medication.

Mr Smith **reported that** he had <u>tried to scratch</u> his ear with a needle. Mr Smith <u>reported trying to scratch</u> his ear with a needle.
