What tenses are used in this story?



Past continuous – was/were + verb + ing	To talk about actions happening simultaneously (at the same time as	
	other actions)	
	 Longer actions 	
	To 'set the scene' for a story	
Past perfect simple – had + third form (past	To talk about 'the past of the past'	
participle)	To indicate one action happened before	
	another action in the past
