- 1. Look for smaller words inside
- 2. Read around and guess the <u>category</u>
- 3. Suffix and prefix?
- 4. Is it positive or negative or <u>neutral</u>?
- 5. Think about word form: adj. / noun / etc.

Adj. = *describing*
