

18th September 2024 Introductions – Other Situations

What other situations might we find in OET roleplays which require us to change the introduction?

- The setting is a school

You may be a school nurse who works in the school or a nurse visiting the school Confirm the child's name, but we possibly know them already Possibly we need to introduce ourselves: "My name is ____ and I am the school nurse" "Thank you for coming to see me" "I am here today to give you your vaccination" "How can I help you today?"

The setting is a care/nursing home

You may be speaking directly to the patient or to the son/daughter/carer of the patient If we are speaking to the patient, we might use phrases such as: "Good morning. You asked to speak to me. How can I help?"

If we are speaking to the son/daughter/carer, we might use phrases such as: "Good morning. Are you the son/daughter of Mr/Mrs ? Ok, how can I help you today?"

We speak to the son/daughter/carer of an elderly patient Make sure that you use the parent's name in the roleplay

We speak to the mother/father/carer of a child

"Can I please confirm your name? And can I confirm your child's name as well?" Make sure that you use the child's name in the rest of the roleplay

We start the roleplay in the middle of the conversation

We don't need to confirm the patient's name We don't need to introduce ourselves

"Now we/I have finished the examination, I would like to discuss..."

"Thank you for letting me examine you"

"Ok, after the examination, the next step is to..."

We speak to a patient in the emergency department

Try to keep the introduction brief – confirm name and ask for the reason for presenting "Can I confirm your name please?"

"What brings you here today" / "How can I help you today?"

We think the patient is a known patient but we don't know what name to use

- 1. Ask the interlocutor what name we can use before the roleplay starts
- 2. We can create a name and use this (the interlocutor will be fine with this and continue the conversation using that name)
