

You are a ward nurse working in the obstetrics unit of Oldtown Hospital. A patient, Mrs Marilyn Johnson, was admitted to your unit from A&E (Accident and Emergency) with abdominal pain and vaginal bleeding.

PRESENTING PROBLEM:

Abdominal pain (hypogastric), vaginal bleeding/discharge, weakness, pallor, shoulder pain,

peritoneal guarding

BP: 90/60mmHg, PR: 100/min

Pregnancy 8 wks (no scan performed yet)

Serum β human Chorionic Gonadotropin (hCG) 1,800 IU/L

Diagnosis: Ruptured tubal ectopic pregnancy

Tests & treatement 20 Jun 2019

TV ultrasound →empty uterine cavity

Free fluid pouch of Douglas

Diagnostic laparoscopy →haemoperitoneum, leaking left tubal pregnancy, ampullary region

Left salpingectomy, (contralateral tube healthy), peritoneal lavage

Nursing management:

Wound dressing & cleaning

Assessment 21 Jun 2019

Good progress overall

Vital signs all within normal range

Painkillers prn (Diclofenac)

Discharge Plan: Pt v anxious to start new pregnancy (?c

Pt advised:

no sexual intercourse for 2 months (use barrier contraception if takes place) & wait

3 months/2 menstrual cycles before pregnancy (arrange Dr urine test: hCG < 15 IU/L)

- future pregnancies high risk (but possible): need to monitor hCG levels, early ultrasound scans ightarrowverify location of embryo

- folic acid supplements
