Prepositions

- 1. I have workedhealthcare.....25 years.
- 2. My procedure isThursday next week.
- 3. She has painher elbow.
- 4. There is a rash his back.
- 5. He has a fungal infectionhis toes.
- 6. Can you attend Mr Smith, please?

General Information

Prepositions are ubiquitous – we use them all the time

Commonly we use them:

- prepositions of time: on / at / in
- prepositions of place: on / at / in / between / under / over / next to / beside
- commonly collocate: regularly go together

Words with similar meanings often use the preposition collocation

- scared / frightened / afraid / terrified of clowns
- rely / depend on

the same word can have different prepositions

sometimes there is no difference/ little difference:

- The patient pointed at the painful area
- The patient pointed to the painful area

sometimes there is a difference:

- Paul shouted to his friend. (I am far away and I need to shout to get attention)
- Paul shouted at the man who dropped litter. (I am aggressively reprimanding somebody)
