1. **Noun phrase: A final course of action taken when all other options have been exhausted or deemed ineffective**
Surgery is considered the **last resort** for treating severe cases of spinal stenosis.
2. **Noun: The state of being noticeable, distinguished, or standing out from the surrounding context**
The patient's enlarged thyroid gland was a **prominence** easily observed during the physical examination.
3. **Adjective/Verb: Restricted or limited to a particular space or area.**
The patient was **confined** to bed rest following the surgery to prevent further complications.
4. **Adjective: Weakened, damaged, or diminished in function**
The patient's **impaired** vision made it difficult for them to read small print.
5. **Verb: To block or hinder the passage, progress, or flow of something**
A blood clot in the pulmonary artery can **obstruct** blood flow to the lungs, leading to pulmonary embolism.
6. **Noun: A bowl-shaped depression or cavity, often used to describe a hollow area left after tissue damage or removal**
The dermatologist noted a **crater**-like ulcer on the patient's leg, likely resulting from chronic venous insufficiency.
7. **Adjective: Torn or broken apart suddenly and violently, often referring to a rupture of a membrane, tissue, or blood vessel**
The patient was rushed to the emergency room with a **ruptured** appendix, requiring immediate surgical intervention.
8. **Noun: A superficial injury to the skin characterised by scraping or rubbing away of the outer layer**
The hiker suffered an **abrasion** on his knee after falling on rough terrain.
9. **Adjective: Rough or uneven in texture or quality**
The doctor advised against using **coarse** fabrics on the burn wound to prevent further irritation.
10. **Adverb: In a manner that indicates approval, preference, or positive outcome**
The patient responded **favourably** to the new medication, with a significant reduction in symptoms.
11. **Noun: The condition of being caught or confined in a restricted space or by surrounding structures**
Nerve **entrapment** in the wrist can lead to symptoms such as numbness and tingling in the hand, known as carpal tunnel syndrome.
12. **Adjective: Based on practical experience, observation, or experimentation rather than theory or speculation**
The doctor relied on **empirical** evidence from previous cases to guide the treatment of the rare condition.
13. **Adjective: Increased in speed, rate, or intensity; experiencing a faster-than-normal progression**
The patient's **accelerated** heartbeat indicated a potential cardiac arrhythmia requiring further evaluation.
14. **Noun: Manner or style of walking, often used to describe abnormalities in movement**
The physical therapist assessed the patient's **gait** to identify any asymmetries or difficulties in mobility.
15. **Verb: To surpass or go beyond a specified limit, amount, or expectation**
The patient's blood pressure readings consistently **exceed** the recommended levels, warranting closer monitoring and intervention.
