1. **Verb: To confirm the accuracy, truth, or validity of something by providing evidence, investigation, or authentication**
The lab results allowed the doctor to **verify** the accuracy of the diagnosis.
2. **Noun: The border, edge, or space at the boundary of something**
The tumour was excised with a wide **margin** to ensure complete removal of any cancerous cells in the surrounding tissue.
3. **Adjective: Of vital importance; crucial or essential**
It's **imperative** to follow strict hygiene protocols in the hospital to prevent nosocomial infections.
4. **Noun: Tiny drops of liquid, typically referring to small particles of a liquid substance**
Respiratory infections can spread through airborne **droplets**, emphasizing the need for proper mask use in crowded settings.
5. **Adjective: Capable of being transmitted, passed, or spread from one person, organism, or thing to another**
Vaccines have drastically reduced the rates of **transmissible** diseases worldwide.
6. **Noun: A formal demand or request for something to be provided or supplied, often made with authority or necessity**
The **requisition** for specialized medical equipment was promptly processed to meet patient care needs.
7. **Noun: A device or panel with a series of switches used for connecting telephone calls or controlling electrical circuits in a building or system**
The hospital's **switchboard** efficiently directed emergency calls to the respective departments.
8. **Verb: To make someone inclined or susceptible to a particular attitude, action, or condition, usually due to prior experiences or factors**
Genetic factors can **predispose** individuals to certain diseases, requiring proactive measures for prevention.
9. **Adjective: Occurring or existing simultaneously or side by side; events or actions happening at the same time**
Managing **concurrent** conditions poses a challenge for both patients and healthcare providers.
10. **Noun: A flaw, imperfection, or shortcoming in something, typically referring to a physical or functional fault**
The prosthetic had a minor **defect** that required immediate adjustment for optimal functionality.
11. **Adjective: Having an oily or slick texture due to the presence of oil or grease; often used to describe surfaces or substances that feel slippery**
The patient presented with a **greasy** complexion due to excessive sebum production, indicating possible hormonal imbalances.
12. **Noun: An individual, often an adult, who accompanies and supervises others, especially in social situations, to ensure proper conduct or safety**
A nurse acted as a **chaperone** during the sensitive examination to ensure patient comfort and ethical standards.
13. **Adjective: Containing or covered in a mass of small bubbles which form on the surface of a liquid**
The wound appeared **foamy**, suggesting the presence of infection and prompting further examination.
14. **Noun: A person appointed to act as a substitute or assistant for another, often carrying out specific duties or responsibilities in their absence**
The **deputy** surgeon stepped in seamlessly during the complex procedure, supporting the lead physician.
15. **Adjective: Lacking in some essential quality or element; not meeting the required standards or expectations**
Her blood test revealed she was **deficient** in iron, necessitating immediate supplementation to restore healthy levels.
