

Main Idea	In OET writing, this means simple finding the vocabulary to express what is <u>common</u> about some details.	19 th May: blurred vision, watery eyes, itchy eyeballs, and blood shot eyes He has eye issues Bad when writing to an opthalmologist Good when writing to a nurse who is not connected to it
Ellipsis	This is when the reader already knows things, so you just need to indicate refer to it using vocabulary like 'aforementioned' This might also be called <u>referencing</u> .	I am writing regarding Mr Jones who was admitted to our hospital for a total hip replacement. He is due to be discharged and now requires further care and support. On 19 th June, Mr Jone <mark>s underwent the aforementioned</mark> surgery.
Grouping	The way you group together things inside the paragraphs can really reduce down the size. Think carefully about paragraph organisation	Bad paragraph grouping: Regarding Mrs Jones' medication, she takes napraxin and Calcitonin daily as required. She was instructed to apply Medi-honey ointment twice a day to wound area on her legs. Please note notice, she is very forgetful with her medications and treatment routine and needs your control. 
