Key things to consider?

E. Indicators for information giving		
E1	establishing initially what the patient already knows	
E2	pausing periodically when giving information, using the response to guide next steps	
E3	encouraging the patient to contribute reactions/feelings	
E4	checking whether the patient has understood information	
E5	discovering what further information the patient needs	



CRITERIA	HOW CAN WE MEET IT?
E1 – <mark>establishing initially</mark> what the patient <mark>already knows</mark>	 We ask a question to find out the patient's initial knowledge before an explanation: Have you ever heard of? Do you know anything about? How much do you know about? – the patient probably knows something, but you want to know how much We pause after giving information to give the patient time to understand and digest
E2 – pausing periodically when giving information, using the response to guide next steps	 We use 'chunk and check' to provide long explanations: We give one piece of information We check understanding or patient's perspective We give the next piece of information
E3 – <mark>encouraging</mark> the patient to <mark>contribute</mark> reactions/feelings	 We want to understand the patient's perspective regarding the information we have just provided: What do you think about that? How do you feel about that? How does that make you feel? How does that sound? Is that ok for you? Do you have any concerns about that? Is that manageable for you? Do you think you can do that?
E4 – <mark>checking</mark> whether the patient has <mark>understood</mark> information	 We want to understand the patient's understanding regarding the information we have just provided: Is that clear (so far)? Does that make sense? Have I been clear (so far)? Do you have any questions about that? Am I being clear? Would you like me to run through that again? I hope that's clear Use 'targeted' questions to check understanding to find out if the patient understands specific details about the explanation:
E5 – <mark>discovering</mark> what <mark>further information</mark> the patient needs	 How long do you need to fast before the operation? What kind of drinks can you have before the surgery? We finish the explanation and we check if the patient needs to know anything more: Do you have any (further) questions? Is there anything else you would like to ask/know? Do you have any concerns? Would you like me to repeat anything? Would you like me to run through anything again? Would you like to ask me anything (about that)? Is there anything you would like to ask me? Is there anything else I can help you with?
