



Reading Part B:

NG feeding tubes

If they are undetected

Displacement of nasogastric (NG) feeding tubes can have serious implications if undetected.

Extract from 'Chaperones: Guidelines for Good Practice'

A patient may specifically request a chaperone or in certain circumstances may nominate one, but it will not always be the case that a chaperone is required. It is often a question of using professional judgement to assess an individual situation. If a chaperone is offered and declined, this must be clearly documented

According to the update, allergens do not need to be written on packaging if

For example, some substances may only cause a reaction if they are administered orally and therefore don't have to be declared if the medicine is only for topical use, and some substances are only declared if there is a certain amount in the product.



Reading Part C:

A common refrain among sleep scientists about two decades ago was that sleep was performed by the brain in the interest of the brain. That wasn't a fully elaborated theory, but it wasn't wrong. Numerous recent studies have hinted at the purpose of sleep by confirming that neurological function and cognition are messed up during sleep loss, with the patient's reaction time, mood, and judgement all suffering if they are kept awake too long.

Turnidge believes another reason for high rates of antibiotic-prescribing is a fear of losing patients. 'General practice is a private business and you've got to keep your customer satisfied, so to speak. There's always a concern that if you don't write the prescription, the patient will go to the family doctor down the road or to the 24-hour clinic to get it.' This problem may be alleviated somewhat in Australia if patients were required to register at a single general practice clinic rather than being able to freely move from one to another. Such a restriction would leave doctors less pressured to placate them.
