



What is listing in OET?

A sentence 3 or more items as the Object

Example:

He bought some a pear, apple, banana, and jacket.



Basic rules:

- All items are separated by commas (except final one)
- In theory, a list can be ANY amount of items
- OET you can have max 4 or 5 items
- You can remove the article if it repeats

Oxford comma: optional

People make mistakes in OET because they don't know the specific rules about TYPES..

RULES OF LISTING

<p>NOUN</p> <p>+</p> <p>ADJECTIVE</p>	<p>Mr Lobo had / experienced / <i>reported</i></p> <p><i>S v o o o</i></p> <p>Rule 1: all items must be nouns (inc. ING) Rule 2: Adjective can be there, but they need to be BEFORE a noun. Rule 3: The <u>verb</u> must match the <u>nouns</u>.</p> <p>She <u>was</u> dizzy, nauseous, and anxious. She <u>felt</u> dizzy, nauseous, and anxious. She <u>seemed</u>* dizzy, nauseous, and anxious.</p> <p>Rule: All items must be adjectives</p>	<p>Mr. Lobo, 62:</p> <p>Chest tightness Cough ↑ at night ECG normal No cardiac hx (history)</p> <p>Mr Lobo <i>had</i> chest tightening, a cough at night, no cardiac history and <u>a normal ECG</u>.</p> <p>Depends on context... unusual.</p> <p>SYMPTOMS</p>
<p>VERB</p>	<p>She <u>experienced</u> dizziness, <u>visited</u> her local clinic, and was <u>prescribed</u> medication</p> <p><i>S v o . v o</i></p> <p>Rule 1: Object need to be noun Rule 2: each item must a VERB Rule 3: Use Passive if someone else did it</p> <p>She sweats, coughs, and vomits in the night [strange]</p>	<p>Ms. Doyle, 37 <i>Fainted</i> - work Complained: dizziness GP next day Prescribed iron supplements Advised blood tests</p> <p>Ms Doyle experienced fainting at work, reported dizziness, visited her GP the next day, and was prescribed iron supplements.</p> <p>SUMMARISING</p>
<p>S+v listing</p>	<p>She experienced dizziness, her father took her to the clinic, and the doctor prescribed medication</p>
